

#### Note:

- ➤ Along Uriarra Road, 2.5 km from turnoff to Stromlo Forest Park
- Two blocks:

  Registered Rural Blocks 402 & 403
- ➤ Size: ~342 Hectares ~845 Acres
- ➤ (Three blocks? —?at least part of Denman Prospect Block 12)





# Why does 'The Block' warrant Protection?



(wide variety, including **Threatened communities** Box gum/grassy woodland)

Wide Variety of Plant Species

Variety of Animal Species

including ACT listed species: Superb Parrot, Gang Gang Cockatoo, Scarlet Robin, White-winged Triller; Pink-tailed Worm Lizard (threatened)

others uncommon: Chestnut-rumped Heath Wren; Dunnart (marsupial mouse)

unknown: most invertebrates, lichens, mosses, fungi

Vital Wildlife Corridor (between Canberra Nature Parks, north-south)











## Varied Habitat Types

A mosaic of habitat types — just a few:







#### Bluetts a vital wildlife corridor

#### Bluetts provides a corridor between Molonglo River Reserve and nearby protected areas

- > Currently Bluetts Block provides corridor for birds and mammals to move across wooded areas, Molonglo River to Murrumbidgee River
- Extends corridor from north Canberra, through Mt Painter, Kama Reserve to Molonglo River Reserve and into Stromlo Forests, Stoney Ridge, to other southern nature parks



## \*\*Bluetts a Valuable, Social Amenity!

Walking paths (for recreation and exercise)



Inspecting wombat burrow



(opportunity to restore connections with nature)

Closely available natural area for education (available for nearby school excursions, research on ecology, restoration of natural environment, wildlife)

Benefits to Molonglo Community to have a Nature Reserve rather than further urban area






Molonglo Valley Plan for the Protection of Matters of National Environmental Significance (NES Plan 2011)

'... **establishment and implementation** of the following **principles**:

- a response to the strong topographic character of the Valley;
- strong connections to the surroundings;
- protection of hills, ridges and views;
- retention of significant trees and shrubs;
- protection of significant natural corridors and habitats.'

NES Plan gives strong reasons for protection of Bluetts Block as a Nature Reserve





### **Threats**



- <u>Fire</u>
- Feral animals cats!!
- Invasive plants
- Eucalyptus dieback









### Threats if Urban Development occurs:


- Loss of valuable community amenity
- Loss of valuable wildlife corridor
- Loss of wildlife habitat
- Loss of threatened habitat and species (Boxgum—Grassy Woodland and Gang Gangs, Pink-tailed Worm Lizard), etc
- Loss of precious trees for carbon storage





## Current plans for Denman Prospect development

(Approved)






- Extension of road, and adjacent multiple apartment developments (Red shading)
- Holborow Avenue extends from Denman Prospect Shops along the back fence of Bluetts Block
- Multi-unit dwellings 60 m from the back fence of Bluett's
- ➤ High density housing development faces the Molonglo River
- No indication of height of apartments (vis a vis fire protection)
- ➤ Of the total 1214 dwellings in this area, 753 are for multi-units; the largest block of units sits on 10,220 m² (2 hectares) and contains 253 units

## Re Block 12 of Denman Prospect plans (the Deferred Area ):

"The deferred area was identified in the EIS exemption for Molonglo Valley Stage 2 (NI2013-338) [2013] as requiring further investigations, where as part of the EIS exemption for the deferred area (NI2017-183) [2017] it was then highlighted to only be used as an **asset protection zone**."

## Our hope for Future of Bluetts Block?


- Ongoing appreciation and enjoyment of this wonderful bushland and its biodiversity by Molonglo Valley residents and broader community
- Legal protection by incorporation into the Canberra Nature Parks system
  - With consequent management of weeds, bushfire risks and feral animals; and
  - > With Friends of Bluetts Block assisting with management
- Adoption of a new name and we suggest an appropriate First
   Nations' name and one has been suggested
