

# Am I your BUSH Bud?

## Button Wrinklewort

### About me:

As cute as a button, this plant is endangered in NSW and Victoria as well as the ACT. The ACT has some of the most viable remaining populations, so the Territory is this species' best chance of survival. The largest population of Button Wrinklewort in the ACT can be found at Stirling Park.

The species grows on the margins of Box-Gum Grassy Woodlands and Natural Temperate Grasslands with a ground layer of various native grasses. You can spot them flowering between December and April, growing to between 20 and 35 cm tall.

### Threats:

Habitat loss and degradation as well as competition by weeds is threatening the Button Wrinklewort. Furthermore, as numbers reduce, the Button Wrinklewort is less able to withstand the challenges of drought, waste dumping and inappropriate mowing and parking of vehicles.
