Re: Upcoming Environment Ministers Meeting and feral horse management in the Australian Alps

Dear Ministers,

On behalf of the **Invasive Species Council**, the **Australian Conservation Foundation**, the **Conservation Councils of NSW and ACT, Environment Victoria, the National Parks Associations of NSW, Victoria and the ACT, CPSU Federal, Victoria and ACT** and the **NSW Public Service Association** we write to request your collective support for coordinated and urgent control of feral horses across the Australian Alps to protect our native wildlife.

As you are aware, the outstanding natural, Indigenous and historic values of the iconic Australian Alps are being rapidly degraded by increasing numbers of highly damaging feral horses. Feral horses move freely across administrative boundaries, meaning that the successful removal of the threat in the Alps requires collective and coordinated effort across jurisdictions.

We are encouraged by the strong statements of support for urgent action that each of you have recently made on this issue. We believe that the Environment Ministers Meeting on 9 June 2023 provides an excellent opportunity to make a collective statement and commit to taking meaningful action together.

In particular, we urge you to use this opportunity to commit to:

- 1. Work together to ensure the urgent and targeted removal of feral horses across the Australian Alps to protect our native wildlife and alpine ecosystems.
- 2. Condemn all acts of intimidation, obstruction and threats of violence towards staff undertaking their lawful duties to remove feral animals.
- 3. **Reinvigorate the Alps Ministerial Council** by holding annual meetings of Commonwealth, NSW, Victorian and ACT Environment Ministers to discuss the management of the Australian Alps.
- 4. **Fund an officer reporting to the Australian Alps Liaison Committee** focussed on coordinated feral horse management across the Alps.
- 5. **Provide in-principle support for the development of new National Heritage Principles** for the Australian Alps for the management of feral animals, including feral horses.
- 6. Provide in-principle support for a National Feral Horse Threat Abatement Plan.
- 7. Explore options for co-funding ongoing removal of feral horses across the Alps.
