Subject/Title: Protect Ngununggula/ Bluetts Block as a Nature Reserve

Dear Minister,

I am writing to call on you to protect the area known as Ngununggula/Bluetts Block as a nature reserve. The area extends across Stromlo Blocks 402 and 403, and Denman Prospect Section 1, Block 12. Now is the time for you to stand with the community to declare the Government's intention to establish the area as a Nature Reserve, and commence the appropriate processes to ensure this happens.

Ngununggula/ Bluetts Block is home to local threatened species including the Gang-gang cockatoo, Superb Parrot, Pink Tailed Worm Lizard and rare marsupials the Slender-tailed Dunnart and Yellow-footed Antechinus.

We are in the midst of a biodiversity crisis with Australia already leading the world on the extinction of mammals, our local threatened species need their woodland home protected.

I call on you to ensure that the biodiversity values and habitat for our wildlife at Ngununggula/ Bluetts Block are protected by establishing the area as a nature reserve.
